TODAY'S READINGS

1st **Reading** Isaiah 60:1-6

(Page 700 of the Old Testament in the Pew Bible)

In Isaiah's vision of God's light shining into the world's darkness, symbolic gifts are brought to God from East and West as tribute and praise. So our Gospel's Magi visitors to the stable are foreshadowed.

2ND READING Ephesians 3: 1-12 at 8.00 am only

(Page 190 of the New Testament in the Pew Bible)

Riches beyond imagining, says Paul, are found in Christ. Though he is in prison for his faith, his gospel cannot be confined – the good news that God's purposes, once so obscure, are now made clear for Jew and Gentile alike.

(Page 1 of the New Testament in the Pew Bible)

Only Matthew tells us how representatives of other strange religions came from the East to offer their homage to the one and only true God, the child who is king for ever over all earthly powers.


(At the offering of gold)
