1ST READING Isaiah 49:1-7 Reader: Dee Ramsay
(Page 689 of the Old Testament in the pew Bible)

Epiphany means manifestation. In this Epiphany season, our readings are showing the ways God has revealed himself. For us, Isaiah's poem has come true in a way he could scarcely have imagined, as he anticipates the appearance of God within one who is destined even before his birth to be the bearer of salvation into all the world.

2ND READING 1 Corinthians 1: 1-9 Reader: John Sawyer
(Page 162 of the New Testament in the pew Bible)

Isaiah's vision of the Lord revealing himself is echoed in this opening greeting from Paul's letter to Corinth. He gives thanks for the spiritual gifts they have received, and shows himself confident that God will strengthen them for the new day of the Lord's appearing.

John the Baptist is given an epiphany of who Jesus really is, and declares his own task to be revealing Jesus. So he directs others to follow Jesus, and some men begin to recognise the Messiah.
