The Israelites' faith was shaken by their enforced exile to Babylon, but here is assurance that at the heart of God is self-giving love; he does not grow faint nor weary, and all who trust in him will find their strength renewed.

Paul ends this letter with the full form of his customary blessing. These simple Trinitarian words of grace, love, and communion have been familiar in every church in every century.
